Principal's Update

I would like to congratulate all staff involved in Under 8's day on Friday 25th May. The morning was a huge success for all involved. It is great we can all come together as a community and celebrate early childhood.

School Sports:

A congratulations to all our students who have participated in the Northern Trials for cross country and golf over the last couple of weeks. Good luck to our students heading off to soccer trials this week. It is wonderful to see our students being successful in the Northern arena.

Staff Professional Development

On Monday the 4th June the teaching staff are having professional development around the annual National Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD). The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD) is an annual collection of data by the Australian Government that counts students who have been identified by a school team as receiving an adjustment to address the functional impact of a disability as defined under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 (DDA). The national data collection is based on the professional judgement of teachers about their students with disability and the level of reasonable adjustment they receive to access and participate in education on the same basis as other students. This is consistent with the obligations of all schools under the Disability Standards

for Education 2005 (the DSE). Schools use existing evidence to support their professional judgement for the inclusion of students in the national data collection.

Behaviour Update:

We have seen a steady decline in Thinking Room referrals over the past couple of weeks, which is great news. We are still experiencing a range of behaviours that see students receiving steps though the students have been able to regulate their behaviour and stay on task. At our fortnightly Behaviour Meeting, it was discussed that teachers will make contact with parents to celebrate successes. Of course, teachers will continue to contact parents if there are some concerns. We believe this strategy will give parents the opportunity to celebrate all the good things their children are doing every day.

In addition, the re-entry on suspensions will change. When a child is suspended they are asked to meet with Mr Insch to discuss a way forward. Parents are encouraged to attend this meeting, along with the classroom teacher (if the suspension has occurred from inappropriate classroom behaviour). We are always looking at improving the behaviour processes in the school and ensuring our students are demonstrating Being Safe, Responsible and Respectful with their behaviour in class and in the playground.

Updating Parent Details:

We are asking all parents to update their personal details: home address, phone numbers and email address. We are investigating the possibility of emailing report cards to families. For this to occur, we need your most up to date email and phone numbers. If there is an emergency, we want to be able to get in contact with you. Please let the administration office check your details and update where appropriate.

Students are working hard to complete off all assessments in time for their reports cards. Continued excellent attendance is the key to give students the opportunity to demonstrate their learning. If students are at school, they have a better chance to learn. Every Day Counts!
